### My Liveable Mildmay

#### *Creating a better sense of 'place' for local people*

#### A STRATEGIC VISION FOR MILD MAY

Making Mildmay's streets and public spaces places for residents of all ages and ability to enjoy. Let's have better spaces, which are greener, less polluted, healthier, less congested and safer. Streets in which we can breathe clean air, in which kids and senior citizens can play, walk and cycle.

In the last 20 years we have seen improvements, as in Newington Green, but also in some places decisions have made things more dangerous for pedestrians like the installation of mini-roundabouts, but decisions have been made piecemeal. We need a vision, which sets out the type of environment we residents want for Mildmay.

We can learn from the wonderful things happening in neighbouring boroughs like Hackney and Waltham Forest, which are supported by the Mayor of London with his Healthy Streets Initiative and funding through the TFL Liveable Neighbourhood Fund.

Key threads of our Vision are:

- Stopping rat-running, encouraging walking and cycling
- Greening and encouraging wildlife
- Encouraging activities in key areas - Newington Green and King Henry's Walk shops
- Making Mildmay a place where residents want to shop locally

A number of exciting initiatives have been proposed, which should be implemented as part of the Vision

- The King Henry's Walk Village Urban Improvement Scheme (including Mildmay Road and Grove, St Jude St and Boleyn Rd)
- Partial pedestrianisation of Newington Green
- Measures to increase wildlife and planting
- Review how to make use of the Green for activities to bring the community together

We propose a visible consultation in the spring, to be held on Newington Green.
